

1. Title

- While the title provides a general background of the topic, it would be better if the title further reflects the objective of the study.

2. Abstract

- The abstract adequately encapsulates the gist of the paper.

3. Problem/ Objective

- The paper clearly identifies the objective of the study. It may need to further articulate its relevance to the conference theme, though.

4. Literature review, conceptual & theoretical framework

- Sufficient review of the related literature, may need to further explain the framework in relation to the objectives

5. Methodology

- While the framework used in the analysis is specified, there is a need to explain briefly how the method of analysis was done.

6. Results/findings

- The paper has interesting findings, especially drawing comparisons between the present topic and that of other works.

7. Conclusion & discussion

- Conclusion is adequate. Further recommendations and explicit articulation of the the relevance of the results to the conference theme and the present times could be added.

8. Contribution to the related field

- It provides an interesting take on the topic.

9. Precise and appropriate use of language

- Needs further proofreading (grammar, citation style)

10. References

- Consistency of the citation needs to be checked, as well as the in-text citations to be reflected in the References and vice-versa.
